Recipe: 125gm butter (chopped), 1 cup plain flour, ½ tsp bicarb soda, 1 cup rolled oats, 1 cup castor sugar, 2 tbs golden syrup, 2 tbs boiling water, ¾ cup desiccated coconut

Method: Combine butter and golden syrup in pan, stir over heat until butter is melted. Stir in combined soda and water, then remaining ingredients. Mix well. Drop rounded teaspoons of mixture about 4cm apart on greased oven trays and flatten slightly. Bake in slow oven for about 20 mins or until slightly golden brown. Cool on tray.

Recipes (to be used for the relevant classes in the Home Cookery Section) –

Caramel Walnut Slice

Base: ½ cup self-raising flour, ¼ cup sugar, ½ cup coconut, 60g butter

Topping: 2 eggs, ½ teaspoon vanilla, 1 cup coconut, 90g walnut pieces, 1 ½ cups brown sugar, ½ teaspoon baking powder

Method: Sift flour into bowl, add sugar and coconut, mix well. Melt butter over low heat, add to dry ingredients, mix well and press into greased baking tray 28cm x 18cm, bake in moderate oven for 15 minutes.

Topping: lightly beat eggs and vanilla with fork, add coconut, chopped walnuts, brown sugar, baking powder, mix well. Spread mixture over partly cooked base, return to moderate oven and bake further 25 minutes or until topping is cooked. Cool in tin cut into squares 5cm x 5cm.

Jam Drop Biscuits

Ingredients: 125g Butter, 1 egg, 1 cup plain flour, 1 cup SR flour, vanilla, ½ cup sugar, pinch salt, Dark jam (e.g. plum)

Method: Cream butter and sugar, add egg and mix well. Add vanilla then flour and salt. Roll into balls about the size of walnuts and press down a little. Make a hole in the middle and fill with jam. Bake in moderate oven till light golden brown. Note# Warmed jam is easier and neater when filling jam drops.

Pikelets

Ingredients: 1 egg, 1 cup SR Flour, ¾ cup milk, 1 teaspoon syrup, ¼ cup sugar, vanilla

Method: Beat egg, syrup and sugar. Add vanilla and milk. Add this mixture to flour, mixing with a whisk. Mix well. Add extra milk if necessary.

Butter Bar

Ingredients: 125g butter, 2 eggs, ¾ cup sugar, 1 teaspoon of vanilla, ½ cup milk, 1 ¾ cups S.R. Flour

Method: Cream butter and sugar and add eggs, vanilla, sifted S.R. Flour and milk. Bake in bar tin at 180°C for 30 minutes or until cooked. Ice top only when cold.

Lazy Daisy Cake

Ingredients: 125g butter, 4 level tablespoons sugar, ½ packet jelly crystals (any colour), 2 eggs, 1 ½ cups S.R. flour, ⅓ cup milk

Method: Combine all ingredients in mixing bowl until blended. Beat for 3 minutes on medium speed with electric mixer. Bake in a bar tin at 180°C for 35 – 40 minutes or until cooked. Ice top only when cold and decorate with jelly bean daisies.

16. No stock entry will be allowed into the grounds without a permit which may be inspected at any time.
