Lemon Cake

1 cup castor sugar, 2 eggs, 125g butter, 1 1/2 cups SR flour, 1 rounded tablespoon of cornflour, 1/2 cup milk, 1 tablespoon grated lemon rind

Sift flour and cornflour, add sugar and lemon rind. Stir in softened butter, lightly beaten eggs and milk. Beat well for five minutes. Spoon mixture into 8" (20cm) round cake tin lined with greaseproof paper. Bake in moderate oven for approx. 40 minutes. Cool, ice on top with lemon flavoured Icing

Pikelets

1 egg, 1 cup SR Flour, 3/4 cup milk, 1 teaspoon syrup, 1/4 cup sugar, vanilla

Beat egg, syrup and sugar. Add vanilla and milk. Add this mixture to flour, mixing with a whisk. Mix well. Add extra milk if necessary

Butter Bar

125g butter, 2 eggs, 3/4 cup sugar, 1 teaspoon of vanilla, 1/2 cup milk, 1 3/4 cups S.R. Flour

Cream butter and sugar and add eggs, vanilla, sifted S.R. Flour and milk. Bake in bar tin at 180°C for 30 minutes or until cooked. Ice top only when cold

Lazy Daisy Cake

125g butter, 4 level tablespoons sugar, 1/2 packet jelly crystals (any colour), 2 eggs,
1 1/3 cups S.R. flour, 1/3 cup milk

Combine all ingredients in mixing bowl until blended. Beat for 3 minutes on medium speed with electric mixer. Bake in a bar tin at 180°C for 35 – 40 minutes or until cooked. Ice top only when cold and decorate with jelly bean daisies

Vanilla Biscuits

170g unsalted butter, 150g caster sugar, 1 large egg, 2 teaspoons vanilla, 2 cups plain flour, 1/2 teaspoon baking powder, pinch of salt.

In a medium bowl, beat the softened butter and caster sugar together until pale and creamy. Add egg and vanilla and beat until combined. Sift over the plain flour, baking powder and salt, mix until combined. Divide to dough into 2 equal portions. Using a floured rolling pin, roll out each portion on lightly floured baking sheets until 1/2 cm thick. Chill dough on the baking paper in the fridge for a least 1hr. Preheat oven to 175°C. Grease and line baking trays. Use cookie cutter to cut out shapes until the dough has been used. Bake to biscuits for approximately 10 minutes.

Choc Marshmallow Slice

Base – 3 Vita brits (crushed), 1 cup SR flour, $\frac{3}{4}$ cup sugar, $\frac{1}{2}$ cup coconut, $\frac{1}{2}$ cup rolled oats, 2 tablespoons cocoa, 140g butter, 1 big tablespoon syrup

Topping – 1 cup sugar, 1 cup boiling water, 1 desertspoon gelatine, vanilla, food colouring

Place dry ingredients for base into a mixing bowl. Melt butter and add syrup. Add butter mixture to dry ingredients and mix until combined. Line a slice tin approximately 20cm x 28cm with baking paper. Bake for approximately 25 minutes in 180°C. Leave to cool.

Topping – Place sugar, boiling water and gelatine into a saucepan and bring to the boil. Cook, stirring over medium heat until sugar dissolves and syrup is clear. Take mixture off the stove and let cool. Whip up in mix master, add vanilla and 2-3 drops of food colouring. Place on top of base and place in fridge to set. Cut into 5cm square pieces.

Conditions of Entry

1. Gates will open to the public 8.00am on Show day.
2. Competitors shall endeavor to send a detailed list of articles they intend to submit for competition. Where possible the list should be delivered to the Secretary at least 3 days before the Show. Each Article on delivery should be correctly labelled with Section and Class details. Entry Fees should accompany each entry.
3. No discount on entry fees will be allowed other than the Membership Entitlement of 10% discount when fees are paid before the 1st March 2024.
4. Exhibits will be received in accordance with the regulations set out in this Schedule.
5. No exhibitor will be allowed to remove or in any way interfere with any exhibit until 5.00pm Show day, unless with permission from the Steward concerned or the Secretary.
6. Agricultural and Horticultural Produce and Home Cooking must be grown or made by the exhibitor.
7. The Judge may award a second or third place instead of a first, or may withhold a prize altogether, when the exhibits are not of sufficient merit.
8. Where exhibits bear the name of an exhibitor or manufacturer, the name is to be carefully covered until judging is over.
9. The Secretary reserves the right to refuse entry into the grounds, to any exhibit where there is reason to accept that it is diseased or dangerous. The Secretary also reserves the right to remove such an entry from the grounds.
10. No award ribbon, other than those awarded at the Show shall be placed on any exhibit whilst in the Showgrounds, without prior approval of the Steward for the section in which it is entered.
11. The committee shall abandon the Show, or any event contained therein, due to wet weather or any other reason which may make such course advisable. Should the show, or any event, be abandoned or cancelled then the exhibitor is entitled to a refund of any entry fees paid for those events not proceeded with. No cause for action, liability, or obligation shall be maintained or incurred because of the abandonment or cancellation.
12. No collectors will be allowed on the grounds except those authorized by the Committee. Any person infringing this regulation will be removed from the grounds.
13. A commission or rebate of 10% of all sales of exhibits effected by Auction or privately, before removal of same on the grounds shall be paid to the Society by the sellers for the benefit of General Funds no later than 14 days after the close of the Show.
14. Precautions will be taken to guard against fire and to protect the property of the Show, but the exhibits will not be insured at a cost to the Society.
15. The Society will not be responsible for any damage, accident, loss or mis-delivery which may be caused through, or by, any exhibit, competitive or non-competitive, and it shall be a condition of entry that the exhibitor shall hold the Society and its servants harmless and indemnified from and against legal action arising from such damages and the Society will not, under any circumstances, hold itself liable for any accidents on the grounds or premises.
16. No stock entry will be allowed into the grounds without a permit which may be inspected at any time.
17. All prize money is to be collected from the office on the day of the Show. All prize money that is not claimed within one month of the show will be returned to General Funds.
18. Pavilion Stewards will be in attendance from 8.00am on the Friday and alternative arrangements for early exhibits may be made by contacting the Chief Steward of the section.

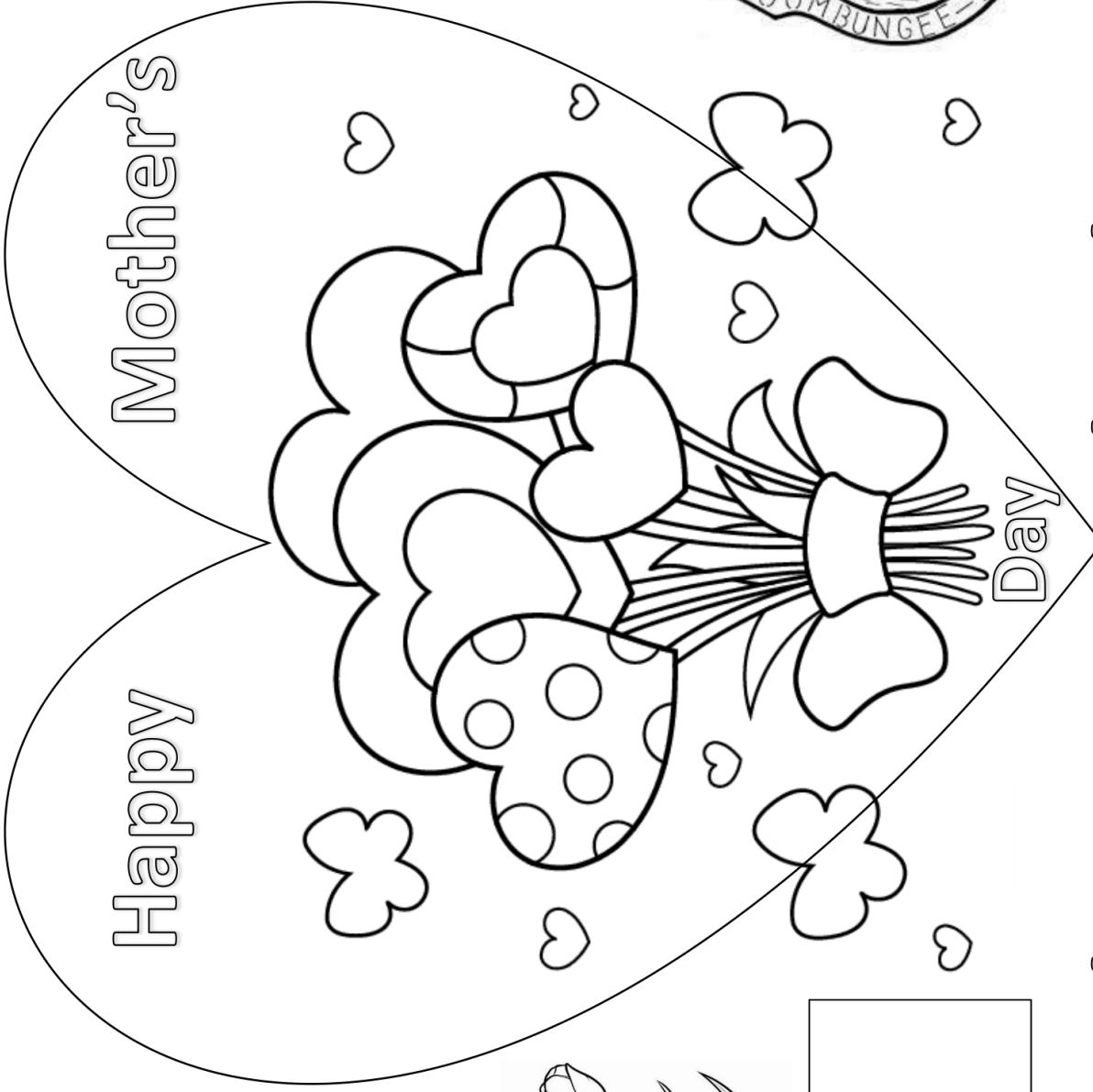
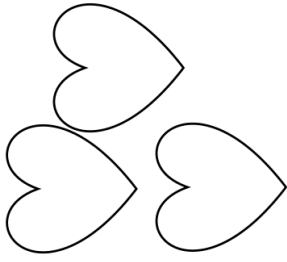

Fire Ant Movement Controls as of 1 July 2016, the Biosecurity Act 2014 (the Act) and the Biosecurity Regulation 2016 (the Regulation) came into effect. There are three fire ant biosecurity zones in place to control the movement of fire ant carriers. To view a map of the zones, visit www.daf.qld.gov.au/fireants

QCAS aims to ensure our local shows comply with the Biosecurity Act 2016. Therefore, all exhibits and/or any plant and soil material that are being transported from these zones must be appropriately treated. Management Techniques Insecticide treatments and the correct storage of potted plants are the two key options to reduce the risk of fire ants in potted plants. Treatment Applying an appropriate treatment to potted plants helps minimise the risk of fire ant infestation. All insecticides must be used in accordance with the conditions of the Australian Pesticides and Veterinary Medicines Authority (APVMA) permit and in conjunction with the product's label. You can search for permits on the APVMA website at www.apvma.gov.au.

Granular insecticides in potting media If using bifenthrin or chlorpyrifos in potting media, the product's dosage rate determines the protection period. Bifenthrin can protect potted plants for more than 24 months, and chlorpyrifos for up to 12 months. Drenching or dipping the protection period varies depending on the insecticide used, such as: Bifenthrin provides 28 days protection Cyfluthrin provides 72 hours protection Chlorpyrifos provides 28 days protection
